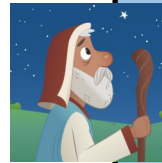


At home...

Make a promise jar and then use it to encourage each other—pick out one promise every day to share. Don't forget to keep the promises you made too!

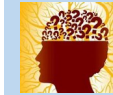


Read the story of Abraham and Sarah in Genesis 12:1-5 and Genesis 15: 1-6

Abraham had a big family. Make a

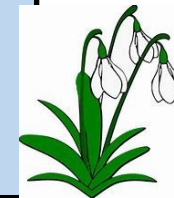
list of all the members of your family — pray for each of them

God has kept His promises to them over the years

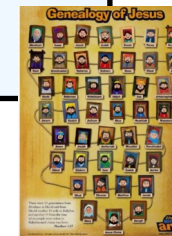

Abraham looked at the stars to remind him of God's promise to him.



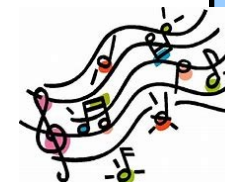
Noah had a rainbow.
