Mon 1 <sup>st</sup>	The Horsham Churches Together leadership asks us to pray for those who have heard the gospel message through the town centre open air Good Friday service and through our Easter church
	services. Pray for further opportunities to speak the good news into the lives of people in our town.
Tue 2 <sup>nd</sup>	Let us especially pray this week for unity in our church following the BU decision on ministers'

Wed 3 <sup>rd</sup>	Praise God for the Baptist Mission Training Centre that has just sent out the first set of 18 trainees as
	outreach workers across Bangladesh. Give thanks for the training they have received and pray for
	them going to areas where the culture may be somewhat different from what they are used to. Pray
	that the Lynches will enjoy the visits from their family this month.
Thu 4 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for the small group of ladies who meet twice a month for Women's Fellowship and for the
	encouragement they receive through attending it. Pray for their meeting this afternoon. Pray, too, for
	the art group who will meet this morning, many of whom are not regular church goers.
Fri 5 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for the many in our congregation who show care to those who need various kinds of help
	and encouragement. Pray for God to give us all pastoral hearts and to guide us to those who need our
	support.
Sat 6 <sup>th</sup>	Let us pray especially today for those who are in hospital or who are unwell at home. Pray for healing
	and that they may know God's presence and love and the care of friends and family. Pray that any
	awaiting surgery or treatment will not have to wait too much longer.
Sun 7 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for those who will be involved in leading the service this morning and for those involved with
	BRBK. Pray that a good number of families will come and that they will be encouraged to come
	regularly so that they can learn how to grow in Christian maturity as families.
Mon 8 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for Life Community Baptist Church, who thank the Lord for opening the door for their pastor,
	Pete Dibdin, to serve as the Horsham Churches Together Development Co-ordinator. Pray for Peter as
	he takes on this role. Pray for the deacons as they meet this evening.
Tue 9 <sup>th</sup>	Let us give thanks with Cally for the financial provision that will enable the Eagle Project to buy a new
	car, to employ a social worker and keep the sessions in the youth prisons going for the whole year.
	Pray for God to continue to work in the lives of those who regularly attend the sessions.
Wed 10 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for the Zoom Prayer Meeting that will go ahead this evening – that the technology will work well
	for everyone and that God will guide our prayers.
Thu 11 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for the team involved in organising and cooking for the Lunch Club today and pray that
	those who come will be encouraged and perhaps challenged by the conversations around the tables
	and the message given after the lunch. Pray, too, for those with sight loss problems who will attend
	Craft Club after the lunch.
Fri 12 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for the Toy Library Easter Event being planned for today. Pray that a good number of families will
	come and participate and that they will get a real sense of what the significance of Easter really is all
	about.
Sat 13 <sup>th</sup>	At the end of April Saturday Kitchen will be closing for the summer. We have built up good, positive
	relationships with our families. Please pray that over the coming months we will find creative ways to
	keep in contact with them.
Sun 14 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for the group of young people who get together on a Sunday afternoon – that they will relate
	well together so that they can encourage one another on their faith journey. Pray for wisdom and
	energy for those who host them and plan the programme each week.
Mon 15 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for what PMA has meant to many people over the years and for the way Celia has led it
	for the last 10 years. Pray that God would lead us to the right person to lead PMA into the future, and
	that God would continue to prosper and bless this valuable work amongst older people in our
	community.

Tue 16 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for Karry and Tash who give of their time and energy to work in our church office each
	day, and pray for daily strength and wisdom for them to cope with all the many and varied tasks they
	are expected to accomplish. May they know just how much they are appreciated by all of us.
Wed 17 <sup>th</sup>	Recent discoveries in Nepal and India have shown that the leprosy bacillus is present in water, soil and
	amoeba in areas where communities are affected by the disease. Pray that the research teams will be
	able to find the significance of this for transmission of the disease.
Thu 18 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for the group of men who regularly attend the Men's Coffee Morning and pray for the
	session this morning.
Fri 19 <sup>th</sup>	Let us pray that the Lord will bring an end to the relentless campaign of violence against Christians in
	northern and central Nigeria. Pray particularly for pastors and other church leaders who are often
	targeted and yet are the ones trying to support those around them. Also pray for the many displaced
	from their home areas and living in difficult conditions.
Sat 20 <sup>th</sup>	Pray for the churches in the Gulu area of Uganda to get more involved in teaching the communities
	living around them about the damage the widespread tree-cutting is doing to the environment. Pray
	for the farmers to be more eager to plant and care for new trees. Pray, too, that this season's rain will
	come when it is needed.
Sun 21 <sup>st</sup>	Pray that all who attend the service this morning will be able to worship God from the heart and be
	able to hear what God is saying to us through the readings, hymns, the message etc.
Mon 22 <sup>nd</sup>	Give thanks for a new greenhouse and land space at Green Pastures Hospital in Nepal where leprosy
	patients will be taught safe farming skills. Pray for provision for more wheelchairs to provide for the
	increase in patients with spinal cord and traumatic brain injuries.
Tue 23 <sup>rd</sup>	Let us continue to pray for the Royal Family at this rather challenging time. Give thanks for Kate's
	bravery in going public with her cancer diagnosis and pray that she will be able to continue her
	treatment and recovery in peace. Pray that she will eventually be restored to full health and strength.
Wed 24 <sup>th</sup>	Let us pray for the Church Members' Meeting this evening, for a clear sense of unity and faith as we
	consider the best ways of moving forward together and realising God's purposes for us as a church.
Thu 25 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for SAT-7's ministry to isolated and persecuted Christians in the Middle East and North
	Africa. Pray especially for those preparing for and presenting programmes aimed at children living in
	areas of conflict and for wisdom for those responding to questions and comments from such children.
Fri 26 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for all those who contribute financially to the ministry of our church and have done so
	over many years. Pray that God will continue to provide what is needed and that he will guide the
	deacons as they make decisions concerning finances.
Sat 27 <sup>th</sup>	Let us pray today for our ministers - that God will continue to give them the strength and wisdom that
	they need for preparing for services, writing weekly messages and Bible notes, caring for the church
	family and for planning for the future. Pray that they will also have time for relaxing with family and
	friends.
Sun 28 <sup>th</sup>	Give thanks for the opportunity that our international group have for meeting together once a month
	to share experiences and challenges and to pray for one another. Praise God for their openness in
	sharing and for the obvious appreciation they have for being able to meet with one another. Pray
	that the meeting today will be an encouragement to all who attend.
Mon 29 <sup>th</sup>	Pray that the military's campaign of violence towards Christian and other minorities in Myanmar will
	cease and that the Lord will protect the displaced and suffering, enabling vital supplies to reach those
	in desperate need.
Tue 30th	Give thanks for those willing to stand for election to the Horsham District Council and pray for God to
	guide in the election that will take place in a few days time. Pray that those voted in will be able to
	work well together and make decisions that will benefit the whole community. Pray for them to act
	with justice and integrity.
