Weekly Message

Different kinds of love

Friday last week, 14th February, was Saint Valentine's Day, the day when we are invited to celebrate love. But what exactly is love? It is not an easy word to define, but the most helpful book I have ever read on the subject is The Four Loves by C S Lewis. He perceptively suggests that the English word 'love' has several distinct but related meanings. We can describe them in the following ways.

<u>Affection</u>. This is the kind of love that is found in families. It is the love of parents for their children, and of children for their parents. It is a feeling of accepting and valuing, which leads to a sense of belonging and togetherness. It offers support and produces trust. It is said that this kind of love is the basis of a stable society, and that without this kind of strong family life society itself can begin to flounder.

<u>Friendship</u>. This kind of love comes when two people share the same interest which they enjoy doing together. It can arise from any shared activity, and that activity can be almost anything. It may be a sport which they both play or watch. It may be walking or swimming or cycling. It may be listening to music, playing music or singing in a choir. It may be visiting stately homes and their gardens. It may be collecting stamps or pottery. Many friendships are formed in churches, because the members all share a common commitment to Jesus Christ. Whatever is the link, friends always like to compare notes on what they have seen and done, and that always strengthens the relationship.

Romance. This kind of love, as mentioned above, is highlighted every year on Saint Valentine's Day. It is a pleasant, joyful and exciting feeling of attraction to another person. It can be based on the appeal of physical appearance or personality. It is the theme of countless songs, and is often what many people have in mind when they use the word 'love'. Two people suddenly or gradually realise that they 'just click''. The feeling may be short-lived, or it may last a lifetime.

<u>Agape</u>. This is a Greek word (pronounced 'agger-pay') which appears many times in the New Testament. It refers to God's love as demonstrated so clearly in the life and ministry of Jesus. It is unselfish love, the love which puts the other person first. It discovers a person's needs and seeks to deal

with them. It is a love which is perpetually giving and always does so generously. Above all it is a sacrificial love, which particularly in the case of persecuted Christians may lead to the ultimate sacrifice, as it did for Jesus.

We may or may not have experienced the other three kinds of love, but this last one is the kind of love which all followers of Jesus are called to show. That is demanding, but it brings much blessing.

One vital component which will underpin this whole process is prayer and during the months of February, March and April there will be designated opportunities when we can come together as a church family to earnestly seek God's leading and guidance in this crucial matter.
