Weekly Message Faithfulness faced with Faithlessness

"What makes authentic disciples is not visions, ecstasies, biblical mastery of chapter and verse, or spectacular success in the ministry, but a capacity for faithfulness. Buffeted by the fickle winds of failure, battered by their own unruly emotions, and bruised by rejection and ridicule, authentic disciples may have stumbled and frequently fallen, endured lapses and relapses, gotten handcuffed to the fleshpots and wandered into a far county. Yet, they kept coming back to Jesus." (Brennan Manning, The Ragamuffin Gospel)

How might we be faithful, faith-full disciples, repeatedly returning to Jesus, however far or frequently we may have strayed or stayed away? Can we be, and feel, faithful, faced with a faithless world characterised by instability, betrayal and disillusionment? Even God lamented, "There is no faithfulness, no love, no acknowledgment of God in the land" (<u>Hosea 4:1</u>).

Faithfulness flows from God's very being and character. David declares, "Your love, Lord, reaches to the heavens, your faithfulness to the skies." (<u>Psalm 36:5</u>) God is faithful, not fleeting, steadfast not short-term. He offers constancy and certainty, an unshakable foundation and impenetrable protection: "He will cover you with his feathers, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness will be your shield and rampart." (<u>Psalm 91:4</u>)

Our Father's faithfulness is not contingent on His children's actions or faith, but stands alone and undeserved. Jacob acknowledges this, admitting, "I am unworthy of all the kindness and faithfulness you have shown your servant." (<u>Genesis 32:10</u>). Being aware of God's faithfulness is being aware of His manifold grace towards us.

God's unchanging, unmerited faithfulness often collides with human unfaithfulness. Scripture is saturated with stories of those struggling with shaky faith. Yet God continues to call us to remain faithful. Why would he call the fickle to such faithfulness? To answer, we could ask, "Why would He call us to anything less?" God does not want anything less than the best for us.

To those of flaky faith, God promises "I will not take my love from him, nor will I ever betray my faithfulness" (Psalm 89:33). To those who have experienced betrayal, disappointment, and heartache from the actions and attitudes of others, the call is heard, "Now fear the Lord and serve him with all faithfulness." (Joshua 24:14). Faced with all the false gods and false promises that this world musters to offer us, let us always be turning back to trust in the truth. May we feature the faithfulness of God, even through our own faltering love and lives. We are called to together remain true to God, when tempted to turn away. Faithfulness is not just a personal choice but a collective, communal responsibility to uphold the integrity of God's covenant in Christ, the Only Faithful One, when the world only offers discouragement and distractions.

Jesus called his people to (<u>Matthew 23:23</u>) "... the more important matters of the law—justice, mercy, and faithfulness." The call of Christ is to go beyond superficial adherence to rules, to embody the values of our Faithful God's kingdom. Such faithfulness can only be Kingdom fruit produced by God's Faithful Spirit (<u>Galatians</u> <u>5:22</u>).
