Weekly Message Choose Gentleness

Our world, regrettably, often prizes and rewards dominance, aggression and bullying. The fruit of the Spirit that is gentleness stands in stark opposition. Gentleness is not to be equated with weakness, timidity or passivity, but is a strength rooted in humility, kindness, faith, patience, and love.

- 1. Gentleness Reflects Christ's character. Jesus said, "Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls." (Matthew 11:29). The King of the universe chose gentleness as the way to relate to humanity. He did not come with cruelty to conquer but with a gentle spirit that invites people into rest. Jesus embodied tenderness toward even the most broken and hostile of hearts. As King, He rode into Jerusalem, not on a war-horse, but on a symbol of peace: "See, your king comes to you, gentle and riding on a donkey ..." (Matthew 21:5)
- 2. Gentleness Transforms relationships. "A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger." (Proverbs 15:1)
 Gentleness acts as an antidote to conflict, hostility and violence (1 Timothy 3:3). Our words and actions can too easily escalate tension or they can patiently promote peace choosing healing over harm and humility over brutality.

King David, despite the rebellion of his son, commanded his commanders, "Be gentle with the young man Absalom for my sake." (2 Samuel 18:5) Powerful David chose gentleness over retribution, even when justice could have demanded otherwise. He reflected God's heart of mercy, and His longing for reconciliation and restoration, rather than punishment.

Gentleness doesn't ignore wrongs or allow injustice to thrive. Rather it actively responds with grace and compassion, even when met with hurt. Apostle Paul urges us to "be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." (Ephesians 4:2) Also, "to be peaceable and considerate, and always to be gentle toward everyone." (Titus 3:2) Gentleness softens the hardest hearts and opens the most stubborn doors.

3. Gentleness Testifies of Christ's love for all, through our actions and words; "Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near." (Philippians 4:5). We are gentle with others because God is gentle with us. He does not treat us as we deserve. Peter reminds us, "Always be prepared to give an answer to everyone who asks you to give the reason for the hope that you have. But do this with gentleness and respect." (1 Peter 3:15) The gospel is told through godly gentleness, not worldly forcefulness. Our appeal, with God's good news of grace through Jesus, is made with a "gentle spirit" (1 Corinthians 4:21) and "by the humility and gentleness of Christ" (2 Corinthians 10:1).

May we each be clothed with Christ's gentleness (Colossians 3:12) and pursue gentleness (1 Timothy 6:11). May our inner selves reflect "the unfading beauty of a gentle and quiet spirit, which is
