Weekly Message Worth waiting for?

Waiting is never easy, yet it is so often necessary. Waiting for the bus. Waiting for a parking space. Waiting for a result of an exam or a medical scan. There are many times and kinds of waiting. We wait for what we want. We wait for what we need. We wait for what we value.

In the scriptures we come across those who are waiting. Abraham, "after waiting patiently ... received what was promised" (Hebrews 6:15). Simeon "waiting for the consolation of Israel" (Luke 2:25). Joseph of Arimathea "waiting for the kingdom of God" (Mark 15:43, Luke 23:51). The people "waiting for Zechariah and wondering why he stayed so long in the temple" (Luke 1:21). The people "waiting expectantly ... wondering in their hearts if John [the Baptist] might possibly be the Messiah" (Luke 3:15). The Pharisees and the teachers of the law "waiting to catch [Jesus] in something he might say" (Luke 11:54). Paul waiting in Athens (Acts 17:16). Forty men waiting in ambush for Paul to kill him (Acts 23:21). The local Maltese people waiting a long time, expecting Paul to swell up or suddenly fall dead after a snake bite (Acts 28:6).

The scriptures also picture a patient God – a God who waits. He waits for His people. He waits for each one of us – for you and me. Peter writes, "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance." (<u>2 Peter 3:9</u>).

God's patience is not hesitation - over His plan to save you. It isn't inactivity, with Him idly standing by, twiddling His thumbs, until we respond. His patience is not indifference, rather it is an invitation to turn and be received by His loving, long-sufferingly outstretched arms - the same arms stretched out upon the cross. Christ's cross is His deliberate, loving pause to give us all the opportunity to come to repentance. You and I are included in the "everyone".

I am thankful that God waits patiently, actively, for me. And in this, each of us can take great comfort - that we must be worth waiting for, that we are of value to Him – we are worth our wait in gold. He must want us – else he wouldn't bother waiting or dying.

And if God lovingly waits for us, then may we also lovingly wait for Him. James writes, "Be patient, then, brothers and sisters, until the Lord's coming. See how the farmer waits for the land to yield its valuable crop, patiently waiting for the autumn and spring rains." (James 5:7) Let us be patient with God's patience. Let us align with His time. If you're struggling with God's pace, receive His peace. You and He are certainly worth the wait.
